- **6. Licensure and Advanced Practice** (Shetarah Goodwin, HR Liaison, Manager, Licensure) A. Monthly stats report was provided for September 2020.
- 7. Legislative Affairs (Rhonda Scott, Deputy Director)
 - A. Annual Report FY 2020
 - 1. Dillion made a motion to accept the 2020 annual report as submitted. Lyn-Kew seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
 - B. Update: Proposed Action on Regulations
 - 1. 10.2701- Examination and Licensure Regulations .01, .05, .10: Amend requirements for testing English competency of foreign nurse graduates whose nursing education was not taught in English; to repeal the waiver for a clinical nursing education requirement for a nurse applying for a license by endorsement in Maryland; define competency in reading, speaking, writing, and listening in accordance with the Nurse Licensure

Compact; define the minimal passing scores for the two English language competency tests the Board recognizes, and repeal the requirement that the Board waive the supervised clinical learning experience requirement for nurse endorsement who attended a nursing program without supervised clinical learning experience.

- 2. 10.27.03- Nursing Education Programs Regulations .01-.03, .05, .08. .09, .11-.18: Comply with federal standards under Title 8 of the Public Health Services Act and maintain recognition by the United States Department of Education as a reliable authority on the quality of nursing education. Amendments are to clarify, reorganize, eliminate, and streamline language in order to reduce regulatory uncertainty.
- 3. 10.64.02- Code of Ethics for Licensed Direct Entry Midwives Regulations: provide a code of ethics that will guide them in their practice and additional regulatory requirements for safe practice and provide a general framework for ethical practice.
- C. Legislative Update: HB837 Public Health Maternal Mortality and Morbidity Implicit Bias Training and Study: Committee requesting the Board to identify the specific licensees and certificate holders who may be mandated to participate in the program. Discussion of bill included the Board not owning the responsibility of identifying who needs the training, but the organizations should.
- D. Tri-District Reciprocity Arrangement (Karen Evans, Executive Director): Agreement to create an interstate medical excellence zone for Maryland, DC and Virginia. The concern is that nursing will be taken over federally, and boards will not be in every state. More information to follow after meetings in the next two months.

October 28, 2020 Closed Session Summary

Closed Session was held from 10:43am to 2:20pm at 4140 Patterson Avenue, Baltimore MD 21215. The same Board members present for the open session were present for the closed session (unless recused from a particular matter). The authority for the closed session was Md. Code Ann., Gen. Prov. § 3-305(b)(13) in order to discuss confidential matters involving applicants for licensure/certification that are prohibited from public disclosure pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 8-303(f), Health Occ. §§ 1-401 et seq., and/or Gen. Prov. § 4-333. The topics actually discussed were confidential matters involving applicants for licensure/certification.

Script for Closing Open Session October 2020

In a moment, I am going to ask if there is a motion to close the open session, but first I am going to walk us through the written statement that is required by the Open Meetings Act to ensure that all Board members agree with its contents.

As documented in the written statement, the statutory authority to close this open session and meet in closed session is General Provisions § 3-305(b)(13), which gives the Board the authority to close an open session to comply with a specific statutory requirement that prevents public disclosure about a particular mater or proceeding. The topic to be discussed during closed session is applications for licensure and/or certification. The reason for discussing this topic in closed session is to discuss confidential matters that are prohibited from public disclosure by the Annotated Code of Maryland, Health Occupations Article, sections 8-303(f), 8-320(a), and 1-401 et seq., and General Provisions Article section 4-333. In addition, the Board may also perform quasijudicial and administrative functions involving disciplinary matters during the closed session.
